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FOREIGN TRADE IN THE FIRST HALF OF 2021



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A trade deficit of 744 billion CFA francs, down 7.5% compared to the first half of 2020

In the first half of 2021, the trade balance deficit widened further by 52 billion CFA francs (up 7.5%) compared to the first half of 2020 and stood at 744 billion CFA francs.


This increase in the trade deficit resulted from the increase in import expenditure of 15.4% compared to the first half of 2020; the 21.5% increase in export earnings recorded over the same period was not sufficient to cover import expenditure.

The coverage rate improved by 3 percentage points to stand at 59.2%, as against 56.2% in the first half of 2020; thus reflecting a stronger relative growth of exports (21.5%) compared to imports (15.4%).

Excluding crude oil, the trade balance deficit stood at 1,170 billion CFA francs, thus worsening by 152 billion CFA francs (15.0%) compared to the first half of 2020.

Compared to the first half of 2020, the coverage rate excluding crude oil was stable and was around 35.6%.


21.5% increase in export earnings

After the drop in export earnings recorded in the first half of 2020 as a result of the COVID-19 health crisis, the first half of 2021 was marked by an increase in export earnings of 191 billion CFA francs (21, 5%) year-on-year.

Over the reference period, Cameroon recorded export earnings worth 1,080 billion CFA francs for 3.8 million tonnes of goods.

The increase in export earnings is attributable to improved sales of some major export products. These are mainly crude petroleum oils which increased by 30.7%; raw cocoa beans (34.2%); raw cotton (59.3%); sawn timber (6.6%) and logs (13.8%).

Exports remained very little diversified and consisted mainly of primary products. The top six products represent 80.0% of export earnings for the first half of 2021. They are mainly crude petroleum oils (39%); raw cocoa beans (13%); liquefied natural gas (9%); sawn timber (7%); raw cotton (7%) and logs (4%).


Import spending up 15.4%

In the first half of 2021, Cameroon's import expenditure amounted to 1,824 billion CFA francs for 5.07 million tonnes of goods, thus recording increases of 15.4% in value and 17.8% in quantity compared to the first half of 2020.

This increase in import expenditure resulted from the increase in value of imports of transport equipment (60%), pharmaceutical products (34%), machinery and mechanical or electrical appliances (26%), rice (21%), wheat and meslin (17%).

This trend was cushioned by the drop in import expenditure for fuels and lubricants (-9%), fish and shellfish (-18%).

The import bill was mainly made up of fuels and lubricants (16%); chemical industry products (13%) including pharmaceutical products (5%), machinery and mechanical or electrical appliances (12%), rice (5%), wheat and meslin (5%).
